238 competitors (new record of entries) entered this Championship representing 31 countries. Brazil had a big delegation with a total of 22 competitors. The largest World Championship ever happened.

2000 WORLDS IN PARADISE

18 January 2000. Mr Gustav Dahlberg is closing the World Championship reading a final speech: "...and I must say that this has probably been the best World Championship



ever..."

I think that everybody there had the same feeling, because it was superb. The organisation did a great job. The place was incredible. The weather was so nice. The Yacht Club, the free food every day after racing, the swimming pool! But in my opinion, the best was the hospitality of the people from Salvador.

Let's talk about the event. The majority of the sailors arrived after New Year. The containers were all there, and except from the Danish team who got their container filled with fuel in Hamburg (!) and had to work a few days to clean everything, the rest was in perfect shape.

The Open Week had to be a good training for the Worlds. The current was very strong the first days, but slowly decreasing day after day. Nevertheless, it was a very important factor to bear in mind. The men and women fleet sailed together and from the very beginning.

Now it's Niki's time. Measurement... It went quite well, without major problems. Just come sails a little too big. The rest was fine.

And there we go! First racing day, two sailing areas. The women (107 sailors) were divided in 2 groups, and the men (70 sailors) preferred to race in fleet. There were two races per day scheduled, and we sailed on schedule from the very beginning until the end.

On the women's course, after the first racing day, Kristine Roug (1, 3) and Sari Multala (3,1) took the lead. Melanie (2,2), Meg (2,3) and Petra (3,2) showed their intentions to be on the top. Shirley won one race, but was 11th on the second.

The second day, with a very similar wind... 10-12 knots... was a good day for Min (1,1) and not so good for the rest... The current was pushing the sailors over the starting line and the black flag was lethal. A long list... The third day (last qualification day) kept the same sailors on the top. Kristine (1,4), Shirley (3,3), Sara Blank came up with 4 and 1, same as Marcelijn (2,1).

The end of the Qualification Series was also very important for all those Nations trying to qualify for the Olympics. There were 7 places and 10 non qualified nations. So, it was over for all those who failed to do so. The finals were very similar to the qualifications. No big changes on the results. The last day was to decide the top 3, although Kristine had a big lead in front of Shirley and Sari and it was hard to loose her gold medal. Sari had a very bad last sailing day (34, 17) and lost the podium, finishing 4th. Meg took her place with a 7th and a 2nd. So, the gold medal went back to Denmark after a few years in the Netherlands. Shirley with her 2nd overall, won her personal qualification for the Olympics. A little bit further Melanie and Sara, the Aussies, finished only with one point difference but with Petra in between, tied with Melanie. That gave the qualification to Melanie in a tight finish for this 2 very good sailors.

The 7 Nations getting their place for the Olympics were ITA (it will be Larissa), NOR



(Siren got the place from NOR but it's not yet decided who will represent the Nation), ARG (Serena will be in Sydney), AUT (Denise), JPN (Maiko), CHN (we do not know who will be the representative, because they finished 32 and 33!) and GRE (Maria Vlachou).

And what about the men? Well... Norway. That was the word.

Mats won the first 2 races. Peter Andersen (7,2) and Mateus (2,12) were also good. The question after racing was: "What about Soren ?" ...oups... bad day ... 37 and 11.

The Norwegians were also in a good shape on day 2. But this time it was Hans Christian (1,1). With the Swedish sailor Axel Netterlid (4,5) and Norwegian Alexander Brekke (9,3) they were the best that day. Soren (2,12) picked up a bit in the overall. Day 3, 5th and 6th race, which meant first discard. That was good for Mats, because he finishes 28th on race nr 6. Soren won his first race and the french sailor Eric Bourie did the same.

Day 4. Mats fights for his championship and put everything back on the right place... 1st and 7th. Mateus won the second race of the

Day 5. Soren wins race nr. 9 and Mats finishes 21st, which brings the scores very close, also with Axel, but Mats do not give VP Racing

any option to the rest of the fleet winning race

Final day. As it had to be. Matts won the 11th race. Axel was 13th and Soren 8th. That means that Mats is the new World Champion! The last race will decide the rest of the podium. Soren wins the race and takes the 2nd overall to Axel. Fourth is Hans Christian and 5th the local sailor Mateus Tavares.

The Brasilians did really good, with 2 on the top 10. Felipe Cunha, also from Salvador, finished 9th overall. They were the only "non Scandinavian" on top 10!

I am obliged to mention the rest day (after 3 racing days). There was a Carnaval on the street, something absolutely incredible. Thousands of people dancing in the street, it was really spectacular.

And the Prize Giving Ceremony, with a big, big party, live music, free beer... unforgettable.

Once again, congratulations to the Organising Committee, Race Committees, Jury, volunteers, but very specially to Mr Cristovam Oliveira. Everybody who was in Salvador knows exactly why...

Bye, Bye Bahia... I really hope to see you soon SHIP again!!!

I would like to say Happy New Year to all my friends and sailors in the Europe Class. The new year brings the start of another racing season here in the USA. Below you will find out how the first two regattas of the year went thanks to our class president, Jaime Mack.

Olympic selection, here in the USA we choose Olympic representatives on the basis of one Trials regatta. The Europe Class will hold their Trials April 6-16th here in San

Francisco Bay. This event will be held in conjunction with the Lasers, sailing on the same course as the Europes, and the Finns and Star boats each sailing on separate courses. Our event consists of four days of racing, two races each day, a mandatory lay day then four more days of racing with two races each day. The overall winner will be our representative to the Olympic Games in Sydney. We expect about 20 people to compete this event.

Prior to our Trials, the local events will be the Spring Dinghy Regatta at the St Francis Yacht Club on March 11-12 and the Alamitos Bay OCR on March 24-26. Lynn Olinger

GERMAN QUALIFICATION FOR SYDNEY 2000 DECIDED - PETRA NIEMANN WINS

Petra Niemann will be nominated for the Olympic Games in Sydney. With her 6th place at the Worlds in Brazil she won the qualification. Her main competitors Doris Wetzel and Christiane Petzke finished 18th and 21st respectively in the Worlds.

They all started under heavy pressure as at least one of them had to be within the first ten in order to be sure that a German Europe will be nominated at all. Christiane Petzke had reached this aim with her fourth place at the Worlds 99 in Melbourne but for a nomination a second top ten place had to be sailed.

In case that more than one sailor reaches this aim, a selection had been defined over a year ago, consisitng of the Europeans last year in England and the Worlds 2000. The Worlds thus had a double importance, especially since Petra, Christiane and Doris were on almost equal terms in England, finishing 9, 10 and 12 respectively.

In the qualification phase of the Worlds Petra laid the basis for her success, finishing top ten in all races leading the overall place 3. Places 15, 36 and 18 in races 7, 8 and 9 of

the finals were rather a drawback for her, and the tenth place overall seemed to run through her fingers. But with strong nerves she finished 2nd and 4th in the following races 10 and 11, making sure that she was within the top ten. With Christiane and Doris being well behind Petra safely won the Olympic qualification.

Techno-News

Dear sailors, measurers, builders

This year our President Gustav and me visited the annual conference of the ISAF, held in Sydney from the 5th to the 13th of november. I had been visiting those committees where technical and measurement matters had been discussed. All our proposals for Class Rules changes from our AGM in Melbourne were adopted this year by ISAF. Therefore the following changes (in italic) will be part of our 2000 Class Rules (I only present the meaning, not the correct wording):

The allowed diameter of the boom section is increased from 76 mm to 77 mm to facilitate the purchase of cheap tubes for boom production (76,2 mm is a common tube size). Our last years proposal for the grandfathering of masts concerning our new Mast Rules had

not been completely accepted at the last years conference. With our new proposal the new grandfathering dates are completed as follows:

Masts shall comply with the new Mast Rules after:

- at fundamental measurements 1 March 2000- at the Olympic Games 1 March 2000- at all other events 1 March 2006 National Authorities may give further allowances.

Sails: Adjustable leech lines are not allowed. This to avoid any development in sailmaking in this direction for not complicating the trimming devices of the sail.

Personal sail numbers are allowed. The procedure of providing the numbers is under the responsibility of the National Authorities or National Class Associations, but they have to ensure that a same number shall never exist twice.

Additional to these changes proposed by ourselves, the ISAF felt the necessity to introduce the following changes to our new Mast Rules:

An inflatable plastic tube is allowed to remain inside the mast section.

The top fitting of the masts does not have to be removable.

With these two changes the existing Marstrom Masts will remain legal without having to make alterations at them. Hopefully this will be a relief to many of you and to future mast producers, keeping the technology less complicated.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - 1999

Dear Europe Class Representatives, Dear Friends,

I welcome you all to our Annual General Meeting, the first in a new century and the first in the new millenium. The year 1999 has been a very busy year for the Class.

We started with the Worlds in Mornington, Melbourne, Australia. The town of Mornington is a small village about 50 kilometres South of Melbourne City. The town is situated at the shore of Phillip Bay a nice water to race on. Our Championships were a part of the big combined World Championships for the Olympic Classes in Melbourne. The different classes were racing on various spots on the large Phillip Bay, every class had its own host Club, our host was the Mornington Yacht Club. We had almost no contact with the other Olympic Classes. Only the final reception has been held with the others. I do not understand the reason to have combined championships when we are not together at all.

In the Worlds we had 111 women sailors representing 29 countries and 57 men from 15 countries. We had various weather conditions: light winds as well as hard winds, in somebody's opinion even to heavy weather, but everyone had his/her chance to become World Champion.

The excellent sailor Margriet Matthijsse (NED) won her second championship, last time she was World Champion in 1997. In the Men fleet Soren Johnsen (DEN) repeated his victory from last year. Congratulations to you both once again.

The organisation was almost perfect, thank you Mornington and Australia.

During the year I attended two other major regattas, the European Championships at Hayling Island in GBR and the European Youth Championships in Workum Holland).

At Hayling Island we had 121 women sailors from

27 nations and 95 men from 18 nations. Both Margriet and Soren repeated their victories from Australia. They both really had a fantastic year! At the Youth Europeans we had 183 sailors from 22 nations. Number one among the girls and European Youth Champion 1999 was Siren Sundby (NOR) and among the boys and European Youth Champion was Hans Kristian Hage (NOR). Congratulations Norway your young sailors will give you many happy moments in the future.

Except these three major events we have had a lot of other championships and important regattas on different level and on various places. I thank the organisers for giving us the opportunity to race in good regattas all over the world. A big thank you also to the sailors travelling from place to place in order to take part in regattas all over the world. Thank you all sponsors for your support last year. The biggest and most important sponsors are the parents of the sailors. Thank you all. Our Annual General Meeting was divided in two parts, the first part was held in Mornington on January 15th. Fifteen member nations and 6 council or committee members were present at the meeting. The matters discussed were the usual ones, I refer to the Minutes distributed to every member association.
