EUROPE VETERAN CUP *Barcelona - Spain - 24/27 August 2000*

The Olympic Harbour of Barcelona was the site chosen by our Veterans (I would prefer to call them Masters) to organise their yearly "Europe Veterans Cup". Guess how many entries ? ... 52 sailors coming from BEL, CZE, ESP, FRA and GER. All a record of participation as up to now an average of 30 sailors entered this championship.

The age limit is 35 (reached before the first day of the regatta) for men and 30 for women, and there are 4 categories: Absolute, Female, Master (50 or more) and Grand Master (60 or more).

It's impressive to see them sailing under windy conditions. I can guarantee that more than one top sailor would have troubles to follow them !

The first day the wind was quite light, but enough to sail one race.

Unfortunately the second day they could not sail at all. No wind, no race. But Sunday, what a day ! South wind 3-4 Bf, sunny, warm... Perfect to complete 3 races.

About the results, J.R. Aragay (ESP), who finished 2nd last year in Belgium, won the absolute category.

H. Montilla (ESP) won the ladies category. C. Masdevall (ESP) was the best Master and H. Kruger (GER) the fastest Grand Master.

Next year the regatta will be organised in Scharmützelsee, 40 km from Berlin - GER.

Europe Racing on the West coast of the USA

13 Europe dinghy sailors compete at the **2000 Junior Olympic Nationals** (thanks to all help from the fleet and my friends) held in Seattle, Washington, June 22-25, 2000.

Although Europe dinghies have been part of the event since 1998, the size of the fleet has been very low partially due to the lack of charter boats. This year's event, held in Seattle, just 2 months after the US Olympic trials in San Francisco, California, offered a unique opportunity for our class and the Junior Olympics.

James Appel and Lee Parks from US Sailing helped us secure 10 places and Coach Luther Carpenter helped us recruit top young women sailors (Luther did his job a little too well which resulted in a 3 sailor bonus!). Only 2 of the sailors could bring their own boats so it was up to the West Coast Europe fleet to come up with 11 private race-ready charter boats!

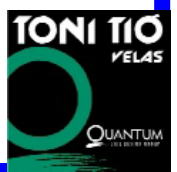

TECHNICAL CORNER

The first important thing I would like to report about is our new licensing system for masts and booms. This system is successfully on its way now. With date of 15/08/00 we have two authorized manufacturers for masts and four authorized manufacturers for booms. We still have administrative problems with the model mast manufacturer, Marstrom, who did not yet present a new mast for prototype measurement.

The two authorized mast manufacturers are the following:

Schutte UniFibre Spars (NED)
Tropical Engineering (GBR)

The four authorized boom manufacturers are the following:

Selden Mast Ltd (GBR) formerly known as PROCTOR
Dinghy-Store Denmark (DEN) The LJ 2000 boom
Needlespar (GBR)
Finessa (SWE) to be approved by ISAF)

As you can see, you already have the possibility to choose between several producers.

With the Licensing system some remarkable changes can be noticed at the material: all the approved manufacturers are issued with a unique Authorized Manufacturers Code (AMC) for their masts or booms. This code is a combination of letters and numbers. For each piece of equipment the producer must pay a licence fee to IECU. Therefore he receives a sticker - the so called Authorized Manufacturer Sticker (AMS) - and the associated measurement form. As not many people will have seen an AMS-sticker before, have a look at the design of the sticker for masts. The boom sticker looks similar, instead of the "M" in front of the number it has a "B". Each new mast or boom must be marked with 1) the AMC- the code for the manufacturer- and 2) the AMS- the measurement sticker comparable to the ISAF plaque for hulls, near the gooseneck. Moreover all new pieces of spars must be issued with: 3) a valid measurement form, connected unmistakably to the respective piece of equipment through the AMC and AMS numbers.

If you are interested in how the new measurement forms look like, have a look on our website: <http://www.europeclass.org>. Under the link "Technical information" you can download the complete set of measurement forms and the Class Rules 2000 in portable document format for Acrobat Reader. As an effect of this licensing system, you -the sailors- will always get your material

together with measurement papers! We always wanted to achieve this standard, with the licensing system we reached it at least for spars. The producers are no longer allowed to sell masts or booms without measurement papers. There will still be a transitional period, where some dealers will have on stock some old material, produced previous to the start of the licensing system. Perhaps they will try to sell this material without measurement papers, you should insist on getting measured material!

I will provide you with further information about the procedural.

The second thing is about an intended amendment of the Class Rules concerning the rudder fittings at the hull. About this, there was already taken a decision at the AGM in Bahia, Brazil, in January: In the rudder blade measurement diagram of the Class Rules the definition of the distance of the fittings at the hull should no longer be defined as the distance between the "bearing surface", but between the "top surfaces" as there are existing rudderstock systems on the market, not using both times the top surfaces of the hull fittings as the bearing surfaces, but going below the lower fitting. To give a clear prescription for those systems, it was discussed, that a maximum thickness for the lower fitting should be introduced. At the AGM in Bahia a measure of 10 mm. was decided. Meanwhile, at several measurements it was recognised that many of the existing rudderstocks going under the lower hull fitting would not fit with this thickness of 10 mm. After a request to the producer of this sort of rudderstock, Marstrom, we got confirmation from him that the distance between the bearing surfaces at his product normally was 142 mm. Checking some of these rudderstocks in Murcia, they were found to be in a range of 140 mm. to 146 mm. Therefore at the continued AGM in Murcia in July the maximum thickness for the lower rudder fitting at the hull was revised to be 5 mm. With this measure all or at least nearly all of the existing rudderstocks are not banned by the rule.

As usual, our own decision is not yet valid as a rule, but still has to be approved by ISAF at their annual conference in November. When approved, it will be valid from the 01/03/01, I will report about this.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

In November ISAF will decide which class is the Olympic Class for ladies in the Olympic Games 2004 in Athens, Greece. The Class made a submission to ISAF in July and we now hope it will be accepted. We hope that as many countries as possible will support us in our struggle to once again have the honour of being Olympic. The meeting will be in Edinborough and we will send as many council members as possible to the place to speak for the Europe. My opinion is that we have a very good possibility.

Since I wrote to you last time we have had two major championships. One in Spain and one in Italy. I was at both as a member of the International Jury.

In the European Championships in Murcia, Spain, we had excellent weather with good winds every day. We started with a nice Open Week as usual. The European Championships consisted of 10 races both for men and women. Margriet Matthijsse became European Champion 2000 with 9 points, she was very good with seven 1st places. Second was Sari Multala, 18 points, and third Sarah Macky, 30

points. European Champion 2000 in the men's division was Hans Christian Hage 15 points, five 1st places, second was Sören Johansen also with 15 points, but only four 1st places. Third was Kevin Orlandi from France with 16 points, and three 1st places. This was really a hard and thrilling fight.

The European Youth Championships in Naples, Italy, was organised by Lega Navale Italiana, Napoli. The Championship was very well organised and the weather conditions were excellent. We had 15 races in both divisions and I think all the sailors were happy. Here again our European Champion Hans Christian Hage from Norway was the first and European Youth Champion, he had seven 1st places, 54,50 points, Second was Jeroen van Catz, 138 points and third Michael Risör, 141 points.. The girls European Youth Champion was Siren Sundby also representing Norway, six 1st places, 28 points, second was Hanne Jansch, 48 points and third Trine Abrahamsen, 65 points. The Class congratulate all the medalists and wish you all the best in the future.

I was very glad to see that almost all the girls

selected for the Olympic Games in Sydney took the opportunity to enter a hard race before the real fight begins, there were over 20 girls selected for Sydney present in Murcia. One other good thing was that in the Youth Championship at Naples we had a fleet of 97 boys present.

One thing that worries me is the rules obedience at the championships. I noticed a lot of mark touchings both at windward and downwind marks. No reactions from the sailors, all continued to sail without any protest or 360° turn. Another thing is collisions, even severe collisions with damage on boats happened, no protest, no 720° turns. This is not fair sailing, it is almost cheating! I hope you will correct your way of sailing during our championships in the future.
