### Technical Corner

**Preliminary draft for 2002 Rule Changings**  
If somebody has any ideas, please enter them.

In 2003 it is not liked to have changings because of the upcoming Olympic Games. It is in the common interest to have no changings in preparing the material for the Games and in the selections.

Actually there are no problems, may be some will arise during the upcoming championships.

#### Class Rules, Measurement 2.4.3.

Class Rules 2.5.1. requires that Equipment Rules of Sailing shall apply if the rules do not specify otherwise.

Equipment Rules of Sailing Part III section H 1.1 says:

“A measurer shall not measure any part of a boat owned, designed or built by himself, or in which he is an interested party, or has vested interest, except where permitted by the MNA”.

So our Rule 2.4.3. could be deleted.

#### Grandfathering

Dates about the beginning and differences in being mandatory about different items are spread over Class Rules and Measurement Forms.

May be it would be a help to delete them all and enter instead a special point where all dates are listed up. See below:

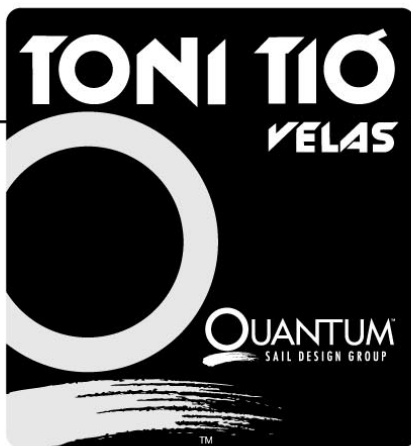

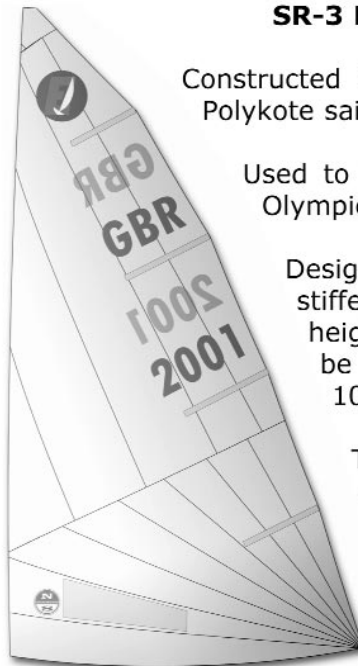

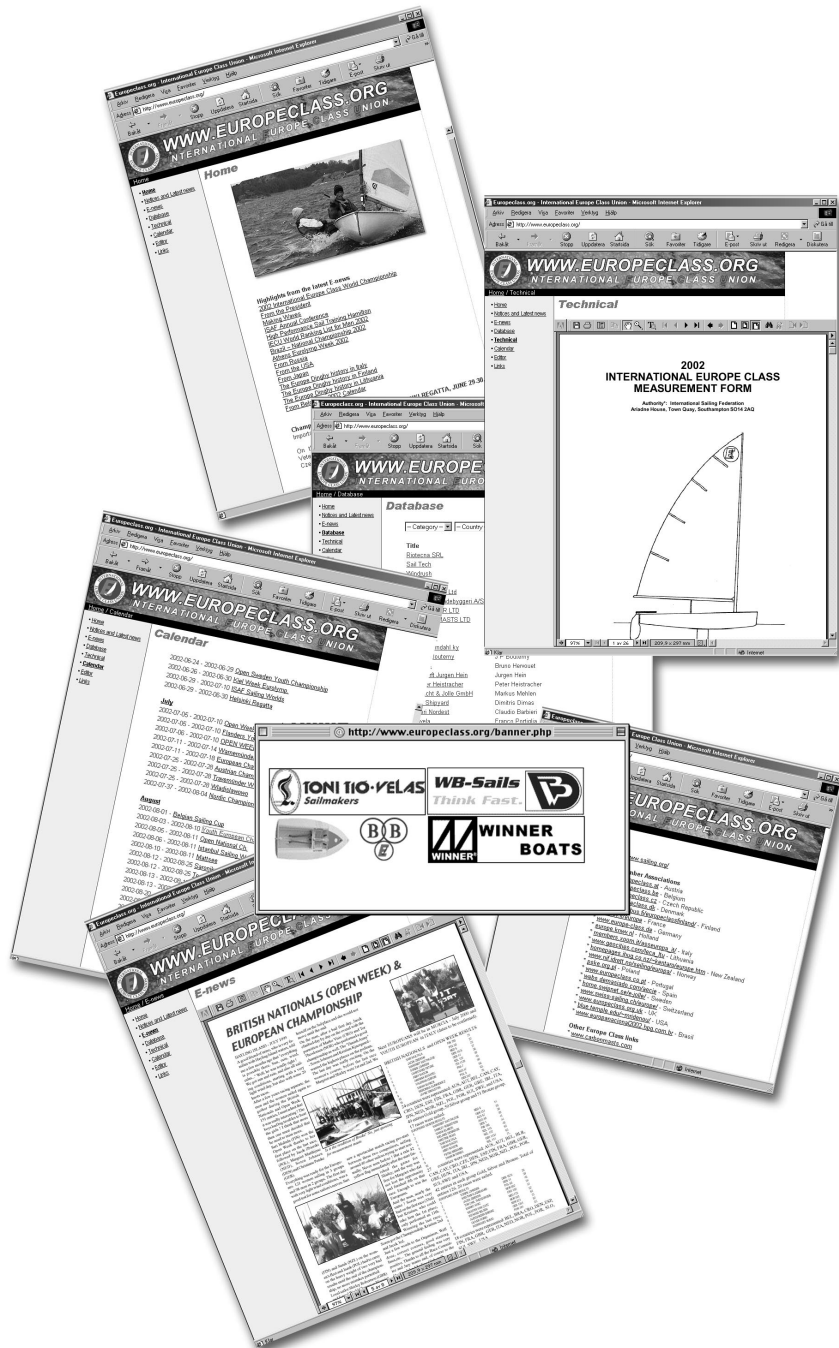
