### Sail development

WB-Sails has done a lot of research around the Europe sail as part of their development work. In addition to the traditional on-water testing with 2 or 3 boats, both wind tunnel measurements and sophisticated computer simulation have been used, striving for faster shapes and more versatile sails. A digital video camera attached to the top of the mast is routinely used to record and analyze sail shape in all wind conditions.

#### Wind tunnel testing

An accurate scale model of the Europe dinghy was created for the wind tunnel testing. Actually the hull used was that of a 470 with a modified bow, since the hull was there from earlier tests and its exact shape is not that important. Much care was given to the design of the mast and the sails, produced in 1:4 scale to fit in the Helsinki University of Technology wind tunnel. The bending of the carbon mast, with sail groove and everything, was carefully engineered so that it was exactly the same as the real mast. In addition, its overall stiffness was adjusted so that the loading on the sailcloth would be similar to the real world sail when blown with a two times stronger wind than in reality. Thus we could use the same sailcloth as in the actual sails, *Read more>>>*

### From France

Spring is traditionally a big period in sailing, and a lot of important events are sailed in a few weeks. In France, as warming, the national regatta took place in April in Les Sables d'Olonnes, and more than 120 competitors competed in light and medium winds. Unfortunately, the Palma Trophy was in the same time and some of the best girls were missing. However, Anne Marteau realized a good performance by taking the second place right behind Mathieu Derand who showed an outstanding speed in medium wind. Anne was using a new hull built by Erplast. This builder was making only optimist dinghies but is now interested by our class. Regarding the results he got in such a few months, he should probably become one of the top makers soon ! After a few days of rest, the best girls went to Hyères and young sailors could learn a lot from the best Europe sailors before going to the French Championship in La Grande Motte. Still light wind for this event won by Blandine Rouille in front of Solène Brain who failed to win a third title. Anne Marteau confirmed her improvement by taking bronze medal. The next important event is of course the famous "12 hours of CVT" (14-15 June). It consists in sailing the largest number of laps in 12 hours. A lot of different classes are invited to sail this event hold in a small lake. You can choose to sail alone or in team, in this case, the crew sailed in the same boat which let some time to enjoy party around the event and it may be the only regatta when you can overtake a melges 24 at 3 o'clock in the morning. Antoine Préveaux seems to be THE specialist of that event regarding he won the last two years, but I guess he will meet some serious opponents this year..

>>> for both the horizontal and the radial design. So 12 m/s in the wind tunnel would represent very accurately 6 m/s on the sea, when it comes to mast bend, sail loading and sail shape. The sail shapes were recorded with several cameras for all the 25 or so tests performed with the radial and the horizontal sail in wind speed ranging from 6 to 25 m/s (3 to 12,5 m/s in the real world). Forces and moments on the model were measured. In addition several flow visualization tests with smoke were done. For the purpose of these tests, the sail was painted black to show the smoke better. The flow pattern was recorded with a video camera.

**Computer simulation digital wind tunnel.**


Computer simulation of the wind flow around sails has evolved quickly during the last few years. Sophisticated tools can give much more detailed information about what is happening around the sail than wind tunnel testing. However, wind tunnel testing is essential in validating or qualibrating the flow software. In practice, the wind tunnel tests are first replicated in the computer, and calculated driving forces and heeling forces are compared to those measured in the wind tunnel. Computer software parameters are then adjusted so that the results agree with measurements. Then we can run many more simulations in the computer, testing different sails shapes and trim, with relatively good confidence that the results can be relied on. As an example, we <sup>3</sup>filled<sup>2</sup> a lightly loaded area in the computer generated pressure map of the sail through adjusting the sail shape in its lower part. Sure enough this design change, when transferred to the real world, produced a faster sail in light and medium airs when two boat testing. The change has since been permanently added to our design. We now take routinely mastcam footage of new designs, to record and analyze sails shapes in the "digital wind tunnel" provided by the computer.


The radial sail in the wind tunnel in 25 m/s, corresponding to approximately 10 m/s true wind in the real world. Rows of tell tails are used to monitor the flow. The horizontal lines are for recording sail shape from above with a video camera. The bend of the mast is realistic and you can see how the sail stretches and wrinkles under the loading. The shadow of the mast makes it appear larger in reality it is accurately scaled from the real mast, but solid carbon to make it stiff enough.




Computer calculated wind speed on the leeward side of the sail, when the apparent wind is 6 m/s (true wind speed about 4 m/s). Max. wind speeds are over 9 m/s. Higher speeds mean a lower pressure, or suction on the leeward side of the sail in simpler words air is "pulling" the sail.



On the windward side the flow is slowed down to 2 m/s. Slow speed means higher pressure, so air is "pushing" the sail on the windward side.




Top view of the Europe with computer generated streamlines around the sail. This illustration shows how complex the airflow around sails can be. For accurate results, the hull model should be included in the simulation, since the flow over the hull influences that over the sails. Ideally the sailor should be modeled, too, but his/her influence on the flow over the sails is minimal: the sailor is almost pure drag.




Another illustration of the complexity of sail flow. When leaving the leech of the sail the air is forced into a rolling motion, swirling into two large vortices in the top of the sail and under the boom. This is the "bad air" behind the boat familiar to anyone racing. These swirls consume energy, bending the airflow around the sail itself and reducing the lift. The leech vortices contribute up to 75% of the air drag of the boat, so no wonder much of the sail computer simulation work focuses on minimizing their effect.

The "bad air sector" seen from behind...




...and overhead. If air wasn't invisible, we would see quite a spectacle every time we sheet the sails.

## FROM SWEDEN

The best sailors from Sweden and from the rest of the world will come to Stenungsund 12-15 June in 2003 to race in the Open Swedish Championships for the Olympic classes. These Championships will be the largest Swedish regatta during the year and 350 to 400 competitors are expected to take part. The regatta centre will be at Stenungsund. The racing will take place on four courses on the fiords of Hake and Askerö from Friday to Sunday.

All the Olympic and Paralympic classes are gathered for the first time to compete for the Swedish Championships. The Championships are open and international which means that regardless nationality the winner will be the Swedish Champion. Probably no Swedish club is able to host such a big regatta and Stenungsund Yacht Club organizes this event together with the Yacht Club Boxvike SS, Getskärs SS, Hellevikstrands KSS, Ljungskile SS and Tjörns SS.

### Classes

The Olympic classes are 470 for men and women, Star, Europe dinghy, Laser, Finn, Yngling, 49er, Tornado and Mistral. The Paralympic classes are Sonar and 2,4 mR. The Junior classes Laser Radial and 420 are also invited.

The website <http://www.ossm2003.org> will be updated daily during the event with news and information. Results and photographs will also be available there.

But this in the future will turn to a professionalism which is not in the spirit of our boat and practice of our sport, boat and sport should be at the disposition of everybody and young sailors, and for the person who wants to develop an agonistic activity remaining a pure amateur.
