## Technical Corner

At the Annual General Meeting of ISAF our Class Rules were subject to discussion, however, only small corrections were made. Moreover, the rules have been changed in a positive way. According to the new rules, instead of a requirement of exception, older hulls are still allowed: Art. 3.2.9.: "Any hull may be used which complies with any previous Class Rules, except:

- a) At the Olympic Games after March 2004
- b) After March 2008
  - (I) at World Championships
  - (II) at Continental Championships
  - (III) at Regional Championships and Events
  - (IV) at any other event where the National Authority together with the Organizing Authority in the relevant Notice of Race asks especially for the hulls reduced tolerances".

## FROM ITALY

The first qualification regatta is over and took place in Lecco (Como Lake). This event started the 2003 sport calendar.

This is the first National Regatta of the 6 ones scheduled which are necessary for the selection of the National Team.

The National Championship, Olympic Classes Regattas and the National Regattas will compute for the Italian Ranking List.

Again this year it has not been easy to elaborate the events calendar, as usual and now more, we had to work to leave space for the International Regattas and Olympic Classes Regattas dates. Moreover if you consider that the ISAF norms are more restrictive, most of them indispensable considering the always increased number of competitors entering the World and Continental Championships and which on another hand is quite positive for the Europe Class, considering its Olympic status, even if it is only for women.

This status difference in between men and women creates qualification and activity problems for the participation to the International and National Regattas with consequences which interferes in the Class Promotion and in the training of our young sailors.

Positive and negative points, like in everything, but in this special case the result is an always major effort and attention in the management of the Class Associations.

The next Qualification Regattas prevised are the first one in Marsala (Sicilia) on March 2 and the following one in Pesaro (Adriatico) on March 29-30.

Meanwhile, our sailors will attend all the International Regattas scheduled in the ISAF/IECU calendar.

## ACTIVITES.

The Dutch Europe Class Union organizes various regattas and other activities throughout the year. During Easter we organize the Spring Cup in Medemblick: 40 to 50 male Europe sailors and many female sailors from various countries. Furthermore, during the weekend before the SPA Regatta we have the Dutch Open Championships for men and a class event for women. In the fall a team racing weekend is planned, which is a fun event in which the sailors can get to know each other even better. Last but not least we sail the so-called United 4 weekends in which mostly Dutch, Belgian and German sailors compete. These weekends are organized by several other youth classes besides the Europe, like the Optimist, Cadet, Laser (Radial) and Splash. Not only however do we organize regattas, we also arrange various training weekends for Europe sailors from all levels and we make sure that one or more coaches are present at the big international events.

## HISTORY OF THE DUTCH EUROPE CLASS UNION

In 1965 the Europe was introduced into The Netherlands. The Dutch Europe Class Union was founded two years later, so last year we celebrated our 35 year anniversary !

Below is the story of the Europe's introduction told by our Honorary President: Kees Kortenoever (taken from the Dutch Europe News in 1977 and translated and edited by me)

### The Introduction by Kees Kortenoever

On a lay day during the European Championships for sailing cars in Le Touquet (France) in the summer of 1965, I was invited by my friend General De Boucher to go and look at the blessing of the fleet by the cardinal at the mouth of the river "De Cauche". The Swede Hans Bergkvist joined us and I have to be honest, I, as a down-to-earth Dutchman, didn't expect much of a spectacle. Once we found a sport at a sand dune, an amazing show unfolded before our eyes.

The cardinal sat on a little anchored ship with a magnificent purple baldachin. First the fishing boats, packed with family and friends, appeared outside the harbour. They sailed by the cardinal while Breton fisherman's songs sounded from the speakers. Then the sailing boats of the local yacht club appeared, grouped by class. The Vauriens went out towards open sea, but the strong wind made them return again to the safe harbour. The last class to appear was a fleet of little one-person dinghies, climbing the high waves and surfing down again. Hans Bergkvist, being President of the International Moth in Sweden, told me that this was the so-called Europe-Moth. Right then and there, I knew what to buy for my 13 year old son Arthur Michiel. He wanted a bigger dinghy and I was convinced that this design would meet a great need.

So I talked about it with Kees van Doesburg and he liked the idea of a dinghy that could be quantity-produced.

We contacted Roland who supplied the hulls initially. Slowly, we started building hulls ourselves. I found some sailors to demonstrate the dinghy. Although people

kept telling me: "we have the Solo and the Finn, why do we need more ?", I was so convinced of the need for the Europe-Moth (which was later called Europe) that I started writing letters to the National Sailing Federation. After five years of hard work, the Europe was acknowledged as a National Class.

At that time, I frequently contacted the ECU (Europe Class Union) and the different countries agreed to each send a request to the IYRU (International Yacht Racing Union). Finally, the Europe was internationally acknowledged.

I must say that I carry warm memories from that time. The European Championships in Oostende (Belgium) with extremely high waves and seasick sailors were truly marvelous. The atmosphere is always pleasant among one-person dinghy sailors.
